

I am officially an alumna of Christ in the City. After two years of learning to radically love the poor, myself, and a community of peers, I have moved out of a room with bunk beds and into a little Philly row house. As I try to gather words for the experiences of the past two years, I am grateful. For the missionaries and staff who laughed with me until I cried, held me in intense sadness, skipped with our homeless friends through the streets of Philly, and **loved me unconditionally, I am grateful**.


The formation I have received at Christ in the City has brought me to a place of dependency on God that cannot be shaken or destroyed.

It was in the breakdowns of our friends on the streets that I learned empathy and emotional awareness. In the moments I chose to stop in the chapel when I was angry that I learned the consolation of the Father. When living on mission with 12 other people with our own personalities and temperaments got to me, I discovered what I need in friendships and how to "love until it hurts" as Mother Teresa instructs us. The days I begged Jesus to heal my wounded heart, I accepted my poverty and cultivated courage.

There will never be sufficient words to put to my time as a missionary. It is still surreal that it is over and life is moving forward in a new way. But I am forever marked by this experience.
